

Did you know we have a fantastic £9,799 in the bank? It's time to get spending - as a welcome gift to our new Headteacher, Mr Gary Spracklen, we presented him with £5,000 to spend on the school. He explains "I am absolutely delighted to have received this gift from POWSA who work so hard to raise funds for our school. This is going to be of great benefit to the children....from new books to new IT equipment!"

It's great to see everyone's hard work pay off and translate into improved learning space and equipment for the children. Gary is very happy to accept our gift and has given a great deal of thought to how it is spent...he plans to spend £2k on library texts including 'classics'. Pre-School will receive £700 of IT equipment. School classrooms will receive a £45 visualiser each. £2k will be spent on creating a new outside area with Mr Gibson and the children drawing up their ideas.
